Lloyd and Ardis Peterson Cancer Symposium hailed as 'the best yet'

Mayo Clinic Health System hosted the 8th annual Lloyd and Ardis Peterson Cancer Symposium on Saturday, Nov. 9. The program focused on patients and caregivers in the cancer journey. Many in attendance remarked that it was "the best event to date." The event is made possible by the Lloyd and Ardis Peterson Family Foundation and showcases the unique resources and the high-quality care available at the Mayo Clinic Albert Lea Cancer Center.

The symposium honors the couple where they lived and worked while simultaneously recognizing the quality care they received from the medical center in Albert Lea. The Petersons were both raised in Albert Lea and in turn, married and raised their family here until they passed away, Lloyd in 1973 and Ardis in 2001. Both believed strongly in being an active part of the community and in giving back. The family established the Lloyd and Ardis

Peterson Family Foundation with all grants directed to the Albert Lea-area to continue their legacy. As both were cancer patients, the Peterson family – Val Koens, John Peterson, and Steven Peterson – along with Mayo Clinic Health System – Albert Lea and Austin created the Lloyd and Ardis Peterson Cancer Education Symposium.

Meet Dr. Bob Bonacci, the new primary care lead for Mayo Clinic Health System-Albert Lea and Austin



Bob Bonacci, M.D., is the new Primary Care physician lead for Albert Lea and Austin. He works with internal medicine, family medicine and pediatric providers in Albert Lea and Austin to create an integrated practice that exceeds patient expectations. Working with the community to understand their needs will be a part of that process. Dr. Bonacci attended medical school at Morehouse School of Medicine in Atlanta, Georgia, which emphasizes the impact that community has on health and wellbeing. During that time he participated in a rural health immersion rotation in Albany, Georgia. Some of his career highlights to date include:

- Ten years at the Mayo Clinic Northwest clinic in Rochester, including obstetrics, prenatal and delivery care
- Curriculum development and teaching residents and medical students
- Program Director for the Family Medicine residency in Rochester
- Partnered with the Hawthorne Education Center to develop the first Mayo Medical School service learning experience to train medical students to work as teaching assistants in the English as a second language (ESL)
- Board certified in <u>Lifestyle Medicine</u>, promoting behaviour change to treat the cause of many chronic diseases

In Dr. Bonacci's spare time, he and his wife, Kerrie, devote much of their time to a church housed at the YMCA in Rochester which they helped develop and launch. He also serves as the medical director for <u>WellConnect</u>, a southeast Minnesota community partnership that coordinates and supports evidence-based and research-tested programs that help people manage their health and prevent disease.
