Emergency Department

Newborn +

Delivers care for severe and lifethreating situations that require immediate medical attention.

Chest pain or pressure

Head injuries

Seizures

Severe abdominal pain

Shortness of breath or pneumonia

Sudden, severe headaches, paralysis or weakness

Anxiety/Depression

When should you call 911?

Don't drive yourself to the Emergency Department for these symptoms. Call 911 right away!

Life- or limb-threatening injury

Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

Signs of stroke, including sudden numbness, slurred speech, severe headache, weakness on one side of the face or loss of consciousness

Signs of a heart attack, including chest pain, pain in the left arm or jaw, sudden weakness or dizziness
